

Rancho Cucamonga's Code Enforcement works with the Community to hold Neighborhood Clean-up

The City of Rancho Cucamonga held its first City funded "Neighborhood Clean-up Day," on Saturday, June 2, 2007. As a part of the City's continual desire to improve the quality of life for residents and enhance the appearance of the community, residents in the area of Hellman Ave and Arrow Route were provided six large trash bins for the disposal of general household and other unwanted items. It was estimated that 120 homes were assisted by City Staff and community volunteers to dispose these items. Representatives from RC Pets were also on site to provide educational materials to residents on the City's various animal services programs, Community Services distributed out information on a wide variety of programs that are offered to the community, and the Police Department spoke to resident's about crime prevention and Neighborhood Watch programs.

The Code Enforcement Division's has been holding "Neighborhood Clean-up Day" since 2004, and because the clean-up events have become such a successful community event, the City Council has decided to continue this program as a way of enhancing the appearance of residential areas within the City. Councilmember L. Dennis Michael commented that, "These events are a part of the City's commitment to high standards—the maintenance of neighborhoods helps to ensure the highest quality of life for our residents."
